The IDTANA Board / 2026 NAIDC Committee has the authority to make changes to the syllabus as needed.

Registration

ENTRY FEES

1. All entry fees are priced and calculated in USD and is the only currency accepted at payment. No refunds will be issued for any reason.
2. Registration and payment is *online only* through **feisentry.com**.
3. A credit card processing fee of 3.5% will be added to each transaction.
4. Entries must be submitted by a CLRG registered teacher or appointed representative. Individual submissions are not accepted.
5. Entries will not be accepted from schools whose teachers are not in good standing with CLRG and their National/Regional bodies.
6. A family registration fee applies to all entries. A family is defined as legal and immediate members from the same household.
7. Teachers in good standing are exempt from the family fee when registering their own legal children.
8. Entries received after the deadline, but before late registration closes, must include the late fee. No new entries accepted after the late deadline.
9. Changes after 6pm ET, May 8, 2026 require committee approval and a change fee.
10. The NAIDC Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry for any reason.

REGISTRATION PROCESS

A competitor's age is determined as of January 1, 2026. All solo competitors must dance within their own age group. Proof of age may be required at any time. Adult competitors must be at least eighteen (18) years of age.

TEAM REGISTRATION

Team dancers may compete in their own age group or higher; competing in a younger age group is not permitted. Mixed 4-hands and figures must include at least one (1) male dancer, and mixed 8-hands must include at least (2) male dancers. At least 25% of dancers must compete in their proper age group (except in Adult Ceilí - see below), with repeat rules applied as outlined by IDTANA. Dancers on a 4-hand team may also compete on an 8-hand team, but may not repeat on another 4-hand. [IDTANA/2025]

Adult Ceilí: Any dancer eligible to compete in Adult Traditional Set, Adult or Advanced Adult Championships is eligible to compete in Adult Ceilí competitions— and only compete in adult category events; they are no longer eligible to compete in Youth category events. (Proposed 2024). Adult dancers may not enter an "& over" team (ie, Mixed 4-Hand 19 & Over). Team age is determined by the average age of the dancers on the team. *Note: Because this is based on the average age of the team, a 41+ year old could be on an Under 40 team and vice versa.*



Event Logistics

OFFICIAL HOTEL BLOCK

The 2026 NAIDC has secured a wide selection of hotels for the Official Hotel Block. The Rosen Centre in Orlando, Florida is the official host hotel. Additional information regarding hotel rates will be released on the official NAIDC 2026 website and social media.

TEACHERS' HOTEL BLOCK

The Teachers' Block will open **Tuesday, March 3rd at 10:00 AM ET** and will close Friday, March 6th at 5:00 PM EST. Reservations within this block are restricted to registered teachers only. Any reservations made by individuals who are not teachers will be cancelled without notice.

GENERAL ATTENDEE HOTEL BLOCK

The General Block for attendees will open **Tuesday, March 10th at 10:00 AM ET** and will be available via the official booking link. A Two-Night Non-Refundable Deposit will be charged at the time of booking. All hotel rates are listed in US Dollars.

FACILITY FEE POLICY

A daily facility usage fee of USD \$100 per person, per day, is required from anyone attending the event *who does not stay within the official NAIDC 2026 contracted hotel block* at the host hotel or approved overflow hotels. This applies to dancers, CLRG registrants, and spectators unless an approved exemption applies.

Attendees who book at a block hotel but reserve outside the official NAIDC block (including online booking channels, AAA rates, points, or similar methods) **will not** be considered part of the Irish dancing room block and will be subject to the daily facility fee. Strict security measures will be enforced to uphold this policy. For more information on the facility please visit: naidc26.com/location#facility-fee

FACILITY FEE EXEMPTIONS

Residents living within a 100-mile/160km radius of the venue location and active-duty military personnel are exempt from the facility fee and may obtain complimentary daily wristbands. Photo identification is required for each wristband issued. Active-duty military personnel are defined as individuals serving full-time in the armed forces; Reserve or National Guard members not serving in a full-time active-duty capacity do not qualify for this exemption.

PROGRAM BOOKS

Printed program books will be available via pre-order only through the official website. Dancer numbers will be published online once assessors are





Rules & Procedures

COMPETITOR NUMBERS, CHECK-IN & ROTATIONS

All dancers or someone nominated by them must collect their number prior to the start of their competition once they have been released and published online approx. 45-60 minutes before the competition starts. Failure to check in or missing a rotation results in disqualification for that round. Competitor numbers not collected once the competition commences will be destroyed, and those dancers will not be permitted to compete. Dancers must follow assigned rotations and notify the Stage Manager of conflicts prior to dancing. Medical emergencies may be accommodated at the discretion of officials.

COMPETITION SPLITS & GROUPINGS

Competition Split: Where the number of entries for a competition reaches 150 or more, it will be divided into an A split and a B split. If the number of competitors reaches 300 or more, the competition will be divided into an A split, B split, and C split. [IDTANA/2023]. If a national solo competition is split, World Medal Holders (WMH) at the time of the entry will be divided evenly in the splits. If there is an extra WMH, that dancer will be placed in the split with the higher number of dancers. [IDTANA/2023]

Groups: Dancers in the Ladies/Girls, Adult and Advanced Adult Championships will be assigned a Group number (i.e.: Group 1, Group 2 or Group 3) indicating whether they will dance in the 1st, 2nd or 3rd section of Round 1. This will be posted well in advance. *Dancers are responsible for ensuring they are side stage ahead of time for their rotation. Failure to check in or missing a rotation results in disqualification for that round.*

SCORING

All IDTANA rules shall apply to these Championships. All competitions will be assessed by a panel of five (5) assessors or in the case of Solo Championships, a rotating panel of five (5) assessors.

Solo Championship Recalls: Each round will be tabulated, and Irish Points will be assigned to each dancer and their highest and lowest Irish points awarded will be dropped.

When the first two rounds of a Solo Championship (including Adult) are complete, the extended-Irish points system will be used to rank the competitors in order of merit. 50% of the participants who dance will be recalled to perform a set dance in all competitions of twenty-one (21) or more dancers. For competitions with twenty (20) or fewer dancers, all participants will be recalled.

The third (set) round will be calculated like round 1 and 2 (dropping high and low Irish points). Each dancer's Irish points from all three rounds will be added together, then dancers will be ranked to determine the winner. In each round, a dancer will accumulate a maximum of 300 Irish points may accumulate an overall maximum of 900 points in a solo championship competition.

Team Championships & Traditional Set Competitions: Irish Points will be assigned to each team or dancer (trad set) and their highest and lowest Irish points awarded will be dropped.

PLEASE NOTE:

- A dancer must be recalled in order to perform their set dance. Any dancer who does not complete the first two (2) rounds of competition cannot be recalled to dance the third round. [IDTANA/2009]
- Any dancer who does not complete the third round of a competition will automatically receive ZERO marks for that round and will only be eligible to feature in the award ceremony as a recalled dancer. Any points allotted to that dancer from the first two rounds shall remain with



that dancer. [IDTANA/2017]

- Where an assessor deems that a dancer failed to complete their performance in any given round, that dancer must receive ZERO marks by each assessor in that round. [IDTANA/2009].
- ALL scores will be verified and signed off on by each assessor before any ranks are determined for each round.

ON STAGE

- All Solo Championships (including Adult and Advanced Adult) will commence with the hard shoe round, followed by the soft shoe round.
- Hardshoe round (1) - The hard shoe round will be performed (3) three-at-a-time for U8 to U15. In all other age groups, including Adult, the hard shoe round will be performed (2) two-at-a-time.
- Softshoe round (2) - For all age groups, the soft shoe round will be performed (2) two-at-a-time.
- All set dances, regardless of age group, will be performed (1) one-at-a-time.

NUMBER CHECK

A number check either part-way through or at the end of each of the first two rounds of a solo championship competition will occur, where all dancers who have already danced that particular round will be called side-stage to appear in front of the assessors one more time to ensure the correct assignment of marks to each dancer. Dancers must be in costume and Irish dancing shoes.

AWARDS

All dancers shall receive a participation item. Dancers are to wear soft shoes for all on-stage award presentations.

All recalled dancers in **Solo, Mixed Adult and Mixed Advanced Adult Championships** shall receive an official IDTANA medal, which will be presented on stage at an official award ceremony. A minimum of 25% of the solo participants will also receive an event-specific award.

For **traditional set competitions** with twenty (20) or fewer dancers, and in the U7 category, all participants will be awarded. For competitions of twenty-one (21) or more dancers, 50% of the participants will be awarded.

For **team competitions** with five (5) or fewer teams, all participants will be awarded. For competitions of six (6) or more teams, 50% of the teams will be awarded.

In all cases, the number of awards will be determined by the *actual number of those who danced* (not the number registered), and calculations will be rounded-up. All dancers must be in full costume to receive awards on stage, and are responsible for their awards following the presentation. The IDTANA Board / 2026 NAIDC Committee will not replace any lost or damaged awards.

First-place winners in Solo, Mixed Adult and Mixed Advanced Adult Championships will receive a perpetual award, which requires the signing of a release form by a Parent/Guardian (or Dancer, if aged 18 or older). It is not mandatory to sign the form; however, if the form is not signed, the award will not be issued. Teachers' awards will be given to all 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners in all team competitions, and also to the teachers of 1st place solo winners. [IDTANA/2002]



QUALIFIERS FOR OIREACHTAS RINCE NA CRUINNE 2027

Qualifiers will be assessed and announced based on the actual number of North American resident dancers who danced (not the number registered), applying the current CLRG formulas. Competitors in the U8 and U9 Solo Championships, Adult Championship, and Advanced Adult Championship do not qualify for Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne.

Presently, there is no replacement opportunity to attend Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne when a qualified dancer from the NAIDC cannot attend due to judging conflicts.

CARRIAGE AIDS & MAKEUP

Current CLRG directives will be applied and enforced, which, at the time of publication, includes a ban on using any non-medically prescribed devices for all dancers, and a ban on makeup, false lashes, and/or facial tanner for dancers in solo and team events in the U8 / U9 / U10 categories. [CLRG/2014] Please refer to the CLRG Rule Book and website for the most current rules. (www.clrg.ie)

MISHAPS & REDANCES

Should, at the opinion of the Stage Manager, the IDTANA Board / 2026 NAIDC Committee, a medical professional, and/or the assessors, a dancer be deemed unfit to re-dance, and a dancer/parent insists on doing so, a waiver exonerating the IDTANA Board / 2026 NAIDC Committee from any and all liability must be completed and signed by the legal parent and/or guardian of the dancer (if under the age of 18) before the dancer may re-dance. Any repeat incident which results in the dancer being unable to complete the required number of bars for that dance will result in the dancer having to withdraw from the event.

Assessors will be instructed to ring a bell to stop the performance when the health and/or safety of a dancer (in solo or team events) is at risk, due to collision with another dancer, injury, or falling, and assessors will be instructed to use their best judgment in the case of open laces, shoes falling off, or issues with costumes/accessories. Should a dancer lose a heel or an entire shoe, they may stand at the back to allow the other dancer(s) to complete their performance, and they will be permitted to re-dance without penalty when deemed practical by the Stage Manager.

If the judges ring the bell to stop a performance during the last eight (8) bars in Round 1 or Round 2 of a solo championship, the dancers will only be required to dance the last 16 bars of that dance. If the judges ring the bell to stop a performance during any part of an open solo set dance or traditional set dance, the dancer will perform the entire dance for their re-dance.

Where feasible, the dancers will be brought back to re-dance no sooner than three rotations later, and no later than five rotations later. Dancers so affected by the bell being rung and permitted to re-dance will be marked at the discretion of each assessor.

MISCHIEF

Any person caught damaging property (whether private property or that of a hotel/venue or the hosting organization) will be requested to leave the premises immediately and will not be permitted to attend any remaining events at these Championships. All parties involved will be billed for damages.

Parents/Guardians are fully responsible for the whereabouts and the actions of their children.

The IDTANA Board / 2026 NAIDC Committee, and its associates, or any hotel/venue owners will not be held responsible for personal injury, property damage, theft, loss, or any claim.



SIDE STAGE AREA

Teachers and dancers wearing clothing depicting their school's name will not be allowed side-stage at major events in North America to interact with competitors once they are in line to compete and/or to greet dancers at the other side of the stage after their performance, if they are within the line-of-sight of the assessors. [IDTANA/2013].

APPEALS & DECISIONS

Legitimate complaints must be submitted to the IDTANA Board / 2026 NAIDC Committee IN WRITING AND SIGNED within one hour of the alleged incident, by a CLRG registered individual. Such complaints must cite the specific rule(s) in dispute, include a brief summary of the incident, and be accompanied by a USD \$160 cash fee. If the appeal is upheld, the fee will be returned.

All decisions made by the IDTANA Board / 2026 NAIDC Committee and/or the assessors, in accordance with the rules for this event and all IDTANA rules, will be final. The IDTANA Board reserves the right to refuse admission to and remove persons from our events. The NAIDC is a private event.

FILMING / RECORDING

Use of video recorders, movie cameras, camcorders, and/or any camera/cell phone that is capable of taking videos will not be permitted during competitions, except for news media as approved by the IDTANA Board / 2026 NAIDC Committee. Further, no flash photography will be permitted during competitions, other than by the official photographer and live streaming service provider.

Please note that by submitting an entry to the event, all entrants acknowledge their agreement to abide by the live streaming rules for the event, and thereby remove the IDTANA Board / 2026 NAIDC Committee, and its associates from any liability associated with the same.

By entering the event, dancers have opted into participating in Live Streaming during competitions and at awards. There is no option to opt out as the Region has contracted for Live Streaming for the event in its totality.

Solo Championships

Solo, Advanced Adult & Adult Championships

SOLO CHAMPIONSHIP ELIGIBILITY

Eligibility to participate in *Solo Championships* at the North American Irish Dance Championships & Conference can be achieved in one of three (3) ways:

- All Open Championship level dancers are automatically eligible.
- All U8 and U9 dancers can be registered at the discretion of their teacher
- All U10 and older dancers must qualify at their regional Oireachtas. The top ten (10) dancers plus 25% of the competition at the regional Oireachtas in each category will qualify for the North American Irish Dance Championships & Conference, subject to being recalled. [IDTANA/2017].

ADULT & ADVANCED ADULT CHAMPIONSHIPS ELIGIBILITY

Adult Championships: This event is open to dancers aged 18 or older who have not competed during the previous five (5) years except as an Adult-level dancer and who has NOT previously placed in the top 3 of a Prelim Championship or participated in an Open Championship.

- This will be a non-qualifying event with entries permitted at teacher’s discretion.
- For the recall round, a Traditional Set dance will be performed.
- The length and speed of music shall be the same as for the other Solo Championships, as well as the policies regarding recalls and awards.

Advanced Adult Championships: This event is open to Advanced Adult dancers. An Advanced Adult Dancer is defined as anyone age 18 or older who has previously placed in the top three (3) of a Prelim Championship in the last 10 years or competed in Open Champ levels in the youth/ & over levels in the last 15 years. An Advanced Adult Dancer has opted to leave youth/ & over categories and once the dancer begins competing in Advanced Adult, the dancer may not return to the youth/ & over categories. An Advanced Adult dancer has opted to leave youth/ & over categories and once the dancer begins competing in Advanced Adult, the dancer may not return to the youth/ & over categories.

- This will be a non-qualifying event with entries permitted at teacher’s discretion.
- The length and speed of music shall be the same as for the other Solo Championships, as well as the policies regarding recalls and awards.

MUSIC RULES FOR SOLO CHAMPIONSHIPS

Speeds for all dances in Solo Championships, Adult Championships and Advanced Adult Championships will be in accordance with current CLRG directives:

Reel - 113 Slip Jig - 113 Double Jig - 73 Hornpipe - 113

Official musicians will play for all solo and ceili events. When musicians are playing, metronomes will be in use at each stage. Dancers MAY NOT supply their own metronome.

- 16 bars of music will be played by the official musicians prior to the commencement of each of the first two rounds of every Solo Championship/Adult & Advanced Adult Competition. [IDTANA/2016]
- Musicians will play an 8-bar introduction, followed by 40 bars of music for Hornpipes and Slip Jigs
- Musicians will play an 8-bar introduction, followed by 48 bars of music for Treble Jigs and Reels.
- Dancers will not be permitted to dance beyond these durations.



SET DANCE CHOICES & SPEEDS

- Set dances will be played with the step introduction, followed by the right and left foot of the step and the set part of the music (right foot only). Dancers will not be permitted to dance beyond these descriptions.
- Dancers in U11+ and Advanced Adult who are recalled to perform a set dance must choose from the CLRG Official List, with the exception of U10 dancers who must perform a 6/8 (Jig) tempo set dance [IDTANA/2015]
- U8 / U9 and Adult Championship dancers must perform a traditional set. Dance speed for traditional sets are set and may not be altered.

FIGURE COMPETITIONS

Teams must follow the parameters as laid out in the [2026 ORnC Syllabus](#), as published by An Coimisiún le Rincí Gaelacha, with two exceptions:

- A Mixed Figure only requires one (1) male dancer
- No more than 50% of the female dancers in a Mixed Figure may be repeated from a Girls/Ladies team. [IDTANA/2010]
- At least 50% of the dancers in each Figure team must be competing in their proper age group.
- 25% of the dancers in each team may repeat from the immediate younger age groups but may do so only once in each category i.e., once in Girls/Ladies Figure and once in Mixed Figure.

DANCE DRAMAS

Teams must follow the parameters as laid out in the [2026 ORnC Syllabus](#), as published by An Coimisiún le Rincí Gaelacha. There will be an allotment of fifteen (15) minutes per team from start to finish, which includes setup, reading of story, performance, and dismantling of set.

STORIES & MUSIC

Narratives for Figure and Dance Drama events must be typed, and six (6) copies must be submitted no later than one (1) hour prior to the published start time of the competition. Teams may use their own narrator to read their story; however, this individual may not be a teacher from the participating school, nor may they appear in clothing which identifies the school.

Music will only be provided for figure teams upon request; otherwise, it is expected that each figure (and dance drama) team will supply its own music by way of live or pre-recorded means, along with someone (not including a teacher) to operate an iPod (or similar device) if needed. Each stage will be equipped with a 1/8 jack connection wire. [IDTANA/2013]
